• Practice Leader Training - 2018 brought a significant increase in programs, as the Foundation sponsored 18 Tai Chi Easy™ Practice Leader training events across the US and India. These training events certified a record 333 new Practice Leaders with an additional 50+ individuals attending as refresher students.



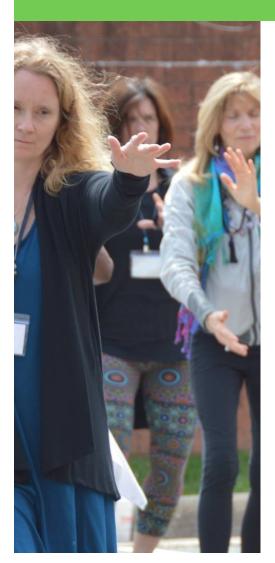

- Community Practice Groups We're growing a nationwide network of community practice groups. 53 groups are currently listed on the HWF website whose leaders offer a low-cost or donation-based practice in their communities. We offer an education portal for leaders to network, share excitement, techniques, ideas, and resources.

2018 EXPENSES BY CATEGORY

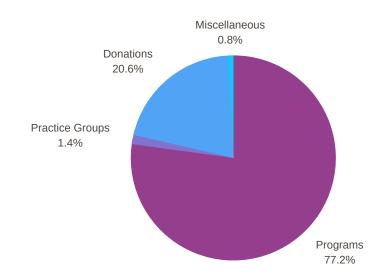
Total Expenses for 2018 = \$188,092
